What does the Crozet Community Advisory Council do?

The Crozet Community Advisory Council (CCAC) is a 15-member advisory committee appointed by the Board of Supervisors, that provides assistance to County staff and the Board on civic and community issues related to implementation of the Crozet Master Plan.

When and where does the CCAC meet?

The CCAC meets on the third Thursday of each month, 7:00-9:00 p.m. at The Meadows Community Center, 5800 Meadows Drive (off of 240) in Crozet.

Who can attend a CCAC meeting?

- Come to the monthly CCAC meetings on the third Thursday.
- Talk with a CCAC member about Crozet projects, concerns, and the Crozet Master Plan.


